How will the proposed BaltimoreLink transit plan affect Woodberry?

MTA has announced a complete bus route overhaul. BaltimoreLink will bring changes to many routes in the City. We analyzed the proposal, and here are the changes that will affect Woodberry. All changes will take effect in June 2017.

- The main change for Woodberry is a new bus line (LocalLink route 22) The new bus line would run from the Woodberry Light Rail to Canton. This line will absorb the Hampden Shuttle route, as well as parts of the 27 and other lines outside our area. LocalLink 22 will follow the route of the Hampden Shuttle in Woodberry. The new line is not a shuttle line. Service would be every 15 minutes during the week, with service every 10 minutes at peak hours. Weekend service would be every 20 minutes in the day on Saturday, and every 30 minutes on Saturday evening and all day on Sunday. The new bus line will operate from 5am to 1am weekdays, and from 7am-11pm weekends.
- Light Rail will get extended service hours on Sunday. Service will start at 6am and run to midnight starting June 2017. The station will also get new bike racks.
- The current 22 would be renamed LocalLink 24. The route will be the same in our area, with more frequent service.
- The current 1 will be renamed LocalLink 91. Bus service will be less frequent. The route will be the same in our area.
- The current 33 will be renamed LocalLink 28. Bus frequency will decrease during peak hours, but increase during the day. The route will be the same in our area.
- The current 27 in Medfield and Hampden will be eliminated.
